In 1995, the name was changed to Philippine Australian Community Services Inc to reflect the composition of Filipinos migrating to Australia under family stream migration. Through the from the grants settlement Department of Immigration and Citizenship (DIAC), PACSI is able to continue providina support and assistance to newly arrived Filipino migrants to establish themselves.
