Who We Are

In 1989, the Philippine Australian Council in Support of Filipino Women was established as a response to the growing number of Filipino women migrating to Australia. Its main purpose was to help these women in their settlement process. In 1995, the name was changed to Philippine Australian Community Services Inc (PACSI) to reflect the composition of Filipinos migrating to Australia under family stream migration. From then till now, PACSI continues to provide support and assistance to newly arrived and long-term Filipino migrants in Australia.

Information, Referral and Casework

We can provide you with information and referrals on your settlement needs such as –

- employment opportunities
- pathways to employment
- enhancing skills in looking for work
- services to get assistance with immigration, legal, domestic violence, family and relationships, child care, aged services, women's health, mental health, income support

We can provide confidential and professional one on one consultation to discuss your current situation, your settlement needs and identify ways to address those needs.

We can provide you opportunities to connect with other members of the Filipino community through –

- participation in information sessions
- volunteering
- joining special groups in PACSI

Who Can Use Our Service

Newly-arrived Filipino migrants (those who have arrived in Australia in the last 5 years) and Filipino-Australians in vulnerable situation (those who are socially isolated or needing community support) can avail of our services.

All PACSI services are FREE.
